Rector's Reflections



Dear Friends,

Why do we celebrate a 175th anniversary? One reason is to celebrate the accomplishments of the past, and, if we are honest, learn from our less-than-successful moments. Christ Church has a long history on the Green in Hudson, and we can learn from both our rich past and the tenacity of our predecessors when times got tough.

The other reason we celebrate an anniversary such as this is to build upon the firm foundation we have inherited so that we can leave a firm foundation for the future. When Christ Church celebrates 200 years in 2042, what will we have left for those who follow us? Based on our conversations and ministry over the last year, I believe we want to build upon our history on the Green and become a church that is more connected to and known in the community. 
Classes for **Pre-K through 6th Grade** meet every Sunday at 10:15.

There will be a special coffee hour after the 10 o'clock service to welcome her. Please be sure to wear your nametag and help Valerie get to know us!





SAVE THE DATE! "The Opioid Epidemic"

Christ Church will host "The Opioid Epidemic" on Sunday, Oct. 15 at 3pm. Greg McNeil, a Hudson resident, will tell the story of his late son, Sam and his battle with opioid dependence. He will share the lessons learned during his family's journey with Sam and how they came to form COVER 2 Resources, a non-profit organization whose mission is to "fight the opioid epidemic through education and advocacy." His discussion will include alternatives to prescription opioids for pain management as well as resources for families struggling with an addiction. In addition McNeil will present preventative measures such as educational programs that are working well throughout the country, some of which are being adopted here in Summit County.

August Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The Vestry meeting opened with prayer and Bible Study. Prayers were offered for a portion of the congregation and prayer cards signed.
- The Vestry focused on accomplishments for 2017 and looked at goals for 2018. Accomplishments including the hiring of a Director of Christian Education and Youth Ministry, better visibility in Hudson (the Memorial Day parade), reorganization of the administrative staff, the work on the Memorial Garden to make it inviting to our neighbors, and our Community Forums. Goals for 2018 include growing our Community Forum series, greater funding for outreach, look to re-establishing the youth choir, and looking at ways to have a Parish Nurse program in the absence of a Community Wellness Coordinator like Mary Pat DeLambo.
- An update was given on plans for the annual stewardship drive and the upcoming capital campaign.
- An update was given on Lunch and Learn. First Presbyterian and Christ Church will partner to keep this program going as it was formerly led by Mary Pat DeLambo who has taken a new position with the Cleveland Clinic.
- Lou Young, Roxanne Grattan, and Eileen Gaston are the retiring vestry members this year. They will form a committee to recruit people to stand for election to vestry at the January 2018 annual meeting.
- The meeting closed with prayer. The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, September 26 at 7:15pm in the library.


