
YOGA CLASS

Stewardship Campaign 2018 "Ready for Lift Off!" Update

2018 Stewardship Committee Pam Zuhl, Irene Gillette, Roxanne Grattan, Reed Stith

As of December 22, we have received 118 pledges, for a total of \$434,369.00. That total includes 14 new pledges and an increase in 54 pledges.



December Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry meeting opened with Bible study and prayer.
- Bob Zuhl presented the 2018 Christ Church budget, which was approved by the vestry.
- Bob Zuhl also presented a summary of the responses to the forum on proposed By-Law changes. Based on the conversation at that meeting and a growing understanding of the changes that need to be made to the By-Laws, the wardens and rector recommend that we work on the By-Laws in 2018 and wait to ask the congregation to act on the changes until the 2019 Annual Meeting. The vestry concurred.
- The vestry looked at the financials through November. Lou Young commented that income is up from what was anticipated and spending is down through November.
- Guy Wylie, Charlotte Reed, and Kathy Garber met with Officer Harold Hutzell from the Hudson Police Department to walk through the building and talk about security concerns. Guy will work with Kathy on a camera system for the door off the parking lot so that door can be kept locked during the day when few people are in the building.
