

Dear Friends,



In the Monastic Tradition, the monks pray many cycles of prayer a day, called Daily Offices. The final gathering of the day is called Compline. Compline is a meditative, personal form of worship, reminding us that God is still present in the quietness. On All Saints' Day, we will have a service of Choral Compline reminding us of all the Saints who are and were with us. The Christ Church Choir will enhance our worship in the chanting of psalms, leading of hymns, and singing of music to help us find the Holy Spirit for prayer. Come and be a part of this opportunity, remembering the words of Ralph Waldo Emerson: "*Let us be silent, that we may hear the whisper of God.*"



# The Christ Church Organ turns 20!

On Pentecost Day in 1998, the first sounds of the new pipe organ at Christ Church were heard at its dedicatory recital on May 31. Since then, our pipe organ, built by the Noack Organ Company in Massachusetts, has been a vehicle to enliven and lead our worship. The organ was fashioned off a very old style of organ building, where the only electrical components to the organ are the blower, which supplies wind to instrument, and the light for the music rack. All of the other parts of the organ are made from wood, tin, lead, zinc, and leather.

We will be celebrating this wonderful instrument at the 10:30 service on November 18th with many festival hymns and organ literature. Mario will be playing music to show off the organ's many voices and colors. One of the pieces we will hear is the Fugue in D Major, BWV 532 by Johann Sebastian Bach. Our Noack organ was built to show off the music of J.S Bach and his contemporaries, so it is fitting that we



will hear Bach at this special service on the 18th. Come, and be a part of this wonderful experience.

## **October Vestry Meeting Highlights**



The vestry met on October 23, 2018 at 7:15 p.m.

- After Bible Study and prayer, the vestry looked at proposed draft of a new set of by-laws for Christ Church, the official name of which is "Code of Regulations." The new code is based on a template Bob Zuhl was given by Bill Powel, the Canon to the Ordinary. A small group will make further revisions, which will come back to the vestry at the November meeting and then be presented to the parish in December for a vote at the Annual Meeting in January.
- Guy Wylie reported on the progress the architects have made on our facilities enhancement project. A small group of vestry members and other stake holders will meet with the architects in November.
- Kathy Garber gave an update on the Stewardship Campaign. At the time of the meeting we had 106 pledges for a total of \$456,604 pledged. There are 13 new pledges. Last year, we had 118 pledges. Our goal for 2019 is 130 pledges. The Generosity Team is following up with folks we have not heard from.
- Bob Zuhl gave an update on the work with Green Systems to install LED lightbulbs throughout the building to save money and be more energy efficient.
- The meeting closed with prayer.
