Rector's Reflections



Dear Friends,

A year ago this month, we were in the midst of our Cottage Meetings at Christ Church, bringing together as many of us as possible to talk about our hopes and dreams for our church. In January at the Annual Meeting, the group of people analyzing the data from those meetings made a presentation, identifying the 10 themes that emerged from those conversations. After another three months of work to identify *potential* projects, we held another parish meeting at the end of April to get feedback and to ask you to help prioritize the 10 themes from the cottage meetings. The top three themes that emerged from that meeting were:

1) Maximize our attractiveness to families, 2) Maximize the use of our buildings, and 3) Maximize the efficiency and durability of our buildings.

Much of the work of the capital campaign will be around themes #2 and #3. We are already at work on theme #1. Late this fall, the nursery where we care for our youngest parishioners will be moved to a larger, more attractive space. The youth room will be moved to a room the youth can decorate and will be outfitted with a small refrigerator and coffee maker, along with some games and other accessories. We are starting at 5th Sunday of the month "Wonder and Worship" service at 9:15, which will combine worship and Christian Education in a format designed to be accessible to children up through 3rd grade.

Much of the work of maximizing our attractiveness to families is not actually about the building. The work is the work of the people, welcoming and engaging families, teaching Sunday School, helping with the soon to be formed Children's Choir, offering to walk a crying child and giving the parents a chance to worship, chatting with new folks at coffee hour, and taking an interest in our youth and helping them find their ministries in the church and in the world. Maximizing our attractiveness to families is the work of all of us....and that work requires that we be here on Sunday morning to welcome them. Maximizing our attractiveness to families may require change. We want to make Christ Church attractive to families NOT because we need families, but because we believe we have something important to offer families as they seek to raise children in the world today. In other words, maximizing our attractiveness to families is not about us! This work is the gospel work of putting ourselves aside to serve others.

We don't have to wait for a capital campaign to make ourselves a more welcoming, nurturing church for families. We just have to want to be that church so much that we each step up to the plate and make welcoming happen.





"Take this Bread"



Update on 2019 Annual Giving Campaign

September Vestry Meeting Highlights



The vestry met on September 25 at 7:15pm in the library.

- The meeting began with prayer and Bible Study.
- The vestry reviewed the building projects completed to date. The replacement of the backflow preventer for the sprinkler system was approved at a cost of \$3,700.00.
- Guy Wylie reported on the meeting with DLR, the architect firm working with us on proposals to bring to the parish as part of the capital campaign.
- Kathy Garber gave an update on our stewardship/generosity campaign. Two days into week two, we have 33 pledges and \$229,514 pledged.
- Charlotte Reed talked about plans to move the nursery into the current youth room, which has better lighting, ventilation, and more space. The youth room will be moved to the multi-purpose room, which will be outfitted for them. This is part of our effort to "maximize our attractiveness to families" which was the number 1 theme to emerge from our cottage meeting project last year.
- Charlotte also reported on the development of a 9:15am Fifth Sunday of the month worship service for families called "Wonder and Worship" which will combine a worship and a Christian Education experience in a service that lasts 45 minutes. This is in response to comments she and Sarah Bhatia have received from families wanting an earlier service.
- The vestry approved the purchase of two replacement furnace heating units for the sanctuary. While we do not need them at the moment, the ones we have are 25 years old and will become harder to replace with a like model that will fit in the space and use the current ductwork.

The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, October 23 at 7:15 in the library.
