Rector's Reflections



Dear Friends,

As I think about Advent and our preparations for the birth of the Christ Child, I am drawn to thinking about all the places I have experienced the Christ Child in the past year. The Christ Child has been born in our midst over and over again, even as we await his birth each Christmas.

The Christ Child is born in our midst:

- in the way members of this parish care for one another, especially in difficult times.
- when guests are welcomed well and made to feel at home here.
- when we respond to human need, whether through First Serve, or serving lunch at Open M, or building a Habitat house, or serving dinner for Family Promise, or knitting for children overseas.
- when we come together to tackle a project much larger than we could reasonably expect to accomplish and when people step up to make a ministry or project happen. Vacation Bible School for 40 children would be one example, and the "Building for Community" campaign would be another.
- when we are singing a great hymn at the top of our lungs, or laughing joyously at the Variety Show, or simply enjoying one another's company at the parish picnic.

These are just a few of the ways I experience the Christ Child at Christ Church. The point of looking for the Christ Child here is not an end in itself, however. The point of finding the Christ Child here is to be better able to recognize Him in the world around us. Jesus was born in a stable when Mary and Joseph had gone to be registered for the census, so out in the world in the midst of ordinary life. During Advent, as we shop, cook, clean, wrap, bake, and make other preparations for Christmas, my prayer is that we can find the Christ Child already in the midst of our ordinary lives. The practice will prepare our hearts to make room for Jesus on Christmas Eve.

Capital Campaign Update



NEW ADDITIONS TO THE MUSIC PROGRAM!

We at Christ Church are so fortunate to have many people who understand the importance of a thriving music ministry program. I am happy to announce the launching of a new program at Christ Church: the Choral Scholar Program. The Choral Scholar Program is a ministry of outreach to young musicians in the area. Choral Scholars provide leadership in the adult choir both during service and during our weekly

rehearsals. This unique opportunity allows young musicians to expand their knowledge of good choral repertoire, increase their musicianship skills, and learn about the Episcopal Church. Please welcome our first Choral Scholar, Ezra Keeton! Ezra is a Senior at Kent State University pursuing a Bachelor's of Music in Vocal Performance. He is very involved in the opera program, musicals, and theater both school and locally. He has appeared in numerous operas and musicals, including Kent State's Spring Production of *The Tender Land*, Tulsa Opera Chorus' *La Bohéme*, and *You're a Good Man Charlie Brown* (Linus). He took 2nd place in Oral Roberts University's New Music Competition earning a scholarship for his performance. He is passionate about growing the arts community in Northeast Ohio and plans to continue his studies after graduation with a focus on Pedagogy.

The 2019 Annual Diocesan Convention November 8-9th

Christ Church Delegates were: Janet Daniels, Midge Karam, and Jim Lang

Our delegates have shared some of their reflections with us below.

The 203rd Diocesan Convention of the diocese of Ohio was held in Sandusky, Ohio on November 8-9, 2019. Resolutions and elections to the diocesan ministries were voted on and are summarized on the Diocese Website, www.doohio.org/convention, as well as the Bishop's Episcopal Address - centered around politics. I would strongly urge you to take a moment to read it. The final paragraph, printed below, was the format for our table discussions and for discussion back in our own Parishes.

"I encourage you in the moments in between to think about how we might do this; to think about what would be hard about it for you; to think about practical things we can do within our congregations and with other congregations to help the world understand that Jesus's prayer that we might be one is one we are ready to live into."

My personal opinion is that this is the task of our time.

What a fabulous opportunity to witness what can seem like behind-the-scenes happenings! I mean - how cool is it that lay delegates and clergy vote together? I was struck by the diversity of those gathered and by the common bond formed via shared worship, prayer, and concern for the life of the church. I found several good ideas while perusing the display area, from Cathedral programming about racial issues to ideas for using Bellweather to a 'Reverse Advent Calendar' that I plan to put into practice this year (ask me for details...). Personal highlights for me included discovering Bishop Hollingsworth's sense of humor - he can be pretty darn funny - and beginning and ending the day with a rousing hymn sung loudly, joyously, unaccompanied, and conducted by the Bishop - maybe we should suggest our political representatives try it!

November Vestry Meeting Highlights



The vestry met at 6pm on Tuesday, November 19

- The vestry meeting opened with Bible Study and Prayer.
- Charlotte led a discussion that reviewed the vestry goals for 2019 (run a successful capital campaign, support the development of a Children's Choir, and offer more fellowship events to give parishioners the opportunity to develop deeper relationships). Then the vestry set goals for 2020: Develop, implement, and plan for the upgrades to the building, funded through the capital campaign; develop a more comprehensive plan for welcoming people new to Christ Church and offering hospitality at Christ Church; supporting the work of Sarah Bhatia in Christian Education by forming a committee of vestry members and parents to work with her in developing new programs and sustaining current ones.
- The vestry reviewed a draft version of the 2020 budget and will vote on a final version in December.
- The vestry discussed plans for coming to the parish at the Annual Meeting with an update on the upgrades to the building and a timeline for the work.
- The vestry heard reports from the Vestry Nominating Committee, Diocesan Convention, and the Finance Committee.

The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, December 17 at 6pm.
