Unless otherwise provided (by Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws, or by Resolution), such meeting shall be held on the third Sunday of January in each year.

Diocese Canon: Title II, Canon 1, Section 5(a): All members of the Parish who are communicants in good standing as defined by the Canons of the Episcopal Church and not being under sixteen years of age shall be qualified to vote in its meetings.

Rector's Reflections



Dear Friends,

What new things did we do in 2018? We hosted "The Underground Railroad" concert, had a presence at the Ice Cream Social and Community Day at the Hudson Farmers' Market, and celebrated Christmas in July. We participated in the Interfaith Thanksgiving Service and opened our doors as a warming station for the Christmas Eve Frosty 5 and Mistletoe Mile. We welcomed Mario Buchanan as our music director and laid the foundation for a Young Choristers' program to begin in 2019. I am sure there are other things as well, but this gives you a flavor for the year that has now gone by.

What most of these ministries have in common is that they helped connect us with the community. Even Christmas in July did so as we collected enough underwear and socks for two elementary schools in Akron. Compline on the Green before Pub Theology, office hours at the Open Door Coffee Company, and our presence in the Memorial Day parade do the same thing.

Here's a secret that's not really a secret: studies show that growing, thriving churches are those that are actively connecting with their community not those whose focus is only on what goes on in the building. Connecting with our community not only increases our visibility in Hudson, which would be a good result in an of itself. Connecting with our community also encourages us to be able to tell our story. What are we about at Christ Church? What do we value? What kind of difference do we seek to make in the world? What do we believe? Who is Jesus? The list of ways to tell our story is endless. What is important is that we are willing to connect, to listen, and to tell.

The Diocese of Ohio is offering "Connecting Communities," a nine month program with three meetings that will help us better connect with God, each other, and our communities. Each church is invited to send a team of 4-6 people to the three Saturday meetings, then to come home with ideas to try over the next weeks and months. I would love to be part of this project and deepen the work we are already doing. Please let me know if you would like to be part of our Connecting Communities team.

When we look back on 2019, my prayer is that we can see ever deepening relationships with God, each other, and the community around us.

Young Choristers Program Update:

Our first rehearsal is Thursday, January 10th!



Greetings! I am so excited that we will be starting rehearsals for Young Choristers this month. After talking with parents who came to the information sessions about a rehearsal schedule, here is the final rehearsal schedule for the Young Choristers.

Thursdays

4:45 - 5:00pm Arrival of Choristers/light snack in the Parish Hall

5:00 - 6:10pm Rehearsal begins in the choir room(undercroft of the church)

The choristers will be singing the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month beginning in February, with Sunday School during church on the 2nd and 4th Sundays. **However, rehearsal will still be every week!**

At our first rehearsal, Thursday the 10th, we will be talking about basic structure of the program, what children will be required to do, and I will have some materials for them to bring home and read with you, like a choir handbook and a choir covenant to sign. With any other activity, we will be covering a lot of material in each rehearsal. It is crucial for the choristers to be present for rehearsals/practices, since we don't want anyone falling behind because they couldn't be present. Since the children will be singing in the choir stalls, they will be fitted with a cassock, which they are responsible for caring for and cleaning.

Wooster Chorus

I am so excited to announce that on Saturday, March 9th, the Wooster Chorus will be stopping at Christ Church on their spring concert tour. This is not a concert that you will want to miss!

Under the direction of Dr. Lisa Wong, Associate Professor of Music at the College of Wooster and Director of Choruses at The Cleveland Orchestra, The Wooster Chorus has been praised for its beautiful sound, high level of artistry, and engaging performances. Wooster Chorus presents several concerts both on and off campus throughout the academic year, and embarks each spring on a weeklong domestic tour. Members of the Chorus collaborate annually with The Cleveland Orchestra and Cleveland Orchestra Chorus. The Chorus has performed at the Central Division conference of the American Choral Directors Association, and also at the state conference (2014 and 2016) of the Ohio Music Education Association.

To keep costs down, we are asking for volunteers to help with housing students for the night of the concert. There is no set number of students you are required to house, however they ask that you take no less than two students for security reasons.



It is an annual international offering of prayer and unity among Christians of all denominations, cultures and languages; this year created by the Christian Communities of Indonesia where the Christians comprise just 10% of the population.



at 340 N. Main St. The ecumenical service, led by local clergy, begins at 10:00 AM. It is followed by a luncheon and guest speaker. The Rev. Jon Dodson, Laurel Lake, Hudson, will give the sermon.

After the service, a luncheon catered by Hudson's Restaurant, is provided for ticket holders.

Our featured speaker after the luncheon is Sr. Anne Victory, who represents the Collaborative to End Human Trafficking. Their mission is to educate and advocate for the prevention and abolition of human trafficking while connecting services on behalf of trafficked persons.

- The vestry approved the budget for 2019 which will be presented to the congregation on January 6.
- Guy Wylie gave an update on the building projects. (Take a look at
 the railings on the steps up to the chape!!). He noted that many
 "must do" projects were done this year because either the church
 was offered an exceptional price (chapel painting), or we had insurance coverage (the roofs), or the damage was so significant that the
 project could not wait (chapel steps and railing).
- Guy Wylie gave a report on the progress of the work with the architects. We are looking at a feasibility study for the capital campaign soon after the first of the year.
- Jim Bear was appointed Chair of the Finance Committee to replace Peter Eells who has resigned after many years of service.
- Bob Zuhl, Lou Young, and Gabe Lefebvre were thanked for their service to Christ Church as vestry members as this was their last meeting.
