Rector's Reflections



Dear Friends,

The month of November begins with All Saints' Day and ends with Thanksgiving.

All Saints' Day is one of my favorite days in the church year. The All Saints' hymns are among my favorites. The reading of the names of our loved ones as candles are lit is poignant. All Saints' Day is a baptismal feast day giving the day even greater depth and richness. The service is a mixture of smiles and tears as we remember those who have gone before us.

On All Saints' Day, we give thanks for those who have gone before us in the faith, for their impact on our lives, and for the ways they illuminated the path of faithful discipleship for us. Some of those folks are people we have known personally while others may be historic figures we have read or heard about, or those people the church has formally named as saints. Either way, our gratitude for these people is expressed on All Saints' Day.

Thanksgiving is, of course, all about giving thanks for our many blessings. Whether a roof over our heads, food to eat, loving people in our lives, things unique to our particular situation (like a new grandchild ☐), this is a day we focus on the abundance of our lives.

While both All Saints and Thanksgiving have gratitude in common, I believe they have something else in common as well. I believe both celebrations call us to live like people who are thankful. What does that look like beyond writing thank you notes, emails, and text messages to people who have done something for us?

I believe living like people who are grateful means, in the words of Fred Rogers, appreciating the holy in each other. Living a grateful person means appreciating the holy in my family and loved ones, but also the barista at the coffee shop, the grumpy cashier at the grocery store, and the driver who cut me off in traffic. The world can be transformed by such gratitude, one person at a time. Transforming the world by gratitude is faithful, gospel work!

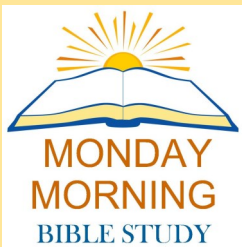

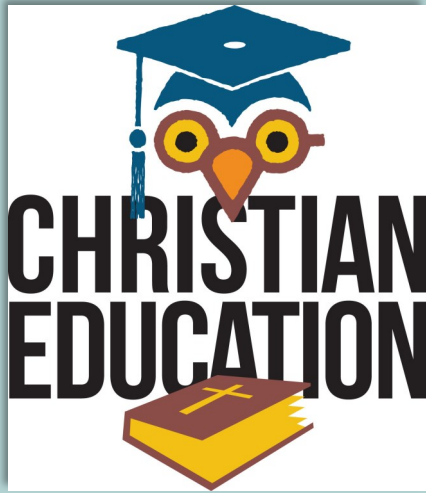
**Sunday, November 24th

October Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry meeting began with Bible study and prayer.
- The vestry looked at the treasurers' report and noted some unanticipated expenses for 2019 that have driven costs up for the year. On the other hand, pledges are still ahead of schedule and cash flow is very good.
- The vestry approved the repairs to the east side of Beebe House where water damage has caused some of the wood beneath the siding to rot.
- Charlotte updated the vestry on the progress of the Capital Campaign and the Annual Campaign. The vestry will meet again in the next couple of weeks to work on bringing our proposed Capital Campaign projects in line with the campaign pledges. Jim Lang and George Murray will continue to reach out to people about pledges to the 2020 operating budget.
- Janet Daniels has put together a Nominating Committee to nominate people for election to vestry and Diocesan Convention delegate at our January 2020 Annual Meeting. That Committee is Janet Daniels, Susan Mailey, Dave McCallops, Len Harrison, and Kate Ribovich, with Charlotte Reed ex officio.
- Christ Church will host the Interfaith Thanksgiving Service on Sunday, November 24 at 7pm.
