

Rector's Reflections



Dear Friends,

Time has taken on a new dimension these days. As I write this, we are approaching Holy Week and Easter, the most sacred time of the year for Christians. We enter into the days of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, his last meal with his disciples, his arrest, trial and crucifixion. And over and over again over the last 20+ years as a priest, I have written that the way we are called to walk through those days is together.

In this time when days all seem to blend together, and something I did two days ago seems like a month ago, and quite frankly I have trouble remembering exactly what day it is, traveling this Holy Week journey together becomes all the more important. This year, we will each have to be all the more deliberate about setting these days apart as we move through them to Easter.

We hear the term "social distancing" a lot right now. We are encouraged, even required, to stay at least 6 feet from any other human being, other than those in our immediate household. However, I have also heard the term "physical distancing" which seems much more accurate to me. We are physically distant, but we are socially and spiritually connected through phone calls, emails, social media, and communication platforms like Zoom.

We are going to experience Holy Week and Easter as physically distant, but together as the socially and spiritually connected people that we are. As I write this, we are still working out details since much could still change between now and Palm Sunday, much less Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter. But the plan is for socially and spiritually connected services on all of those days as outlined on the following page of this Communicant.

Church has never been just about the building. Church has always been about God's people gathered, however they could, inviting the Spirit to work among them, so they could be God's resurrection people in the world. Nothing, not even COVID-19, can change that reality!






CHILDREN'S CHAPEL via ZOOM

March Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry met via Zoom on Tuesday, March 24.
- The meeting began with Bible study and prayer.
- The vestry noted that income was down in February, even before COVID-19 required the cancelling of services.
- Outreach grants for 2020 were approved by the vestry as recommended by the Outreach Ministry Team.
 - Bexley-Seabury Seminary: \$1000
 - Community Resource Coordinator: \$1000
 - Habitat for Humanity: \$2200 (plus the \$800 from the Pancake Supper)
 - The Bail Project (designated for Cleveland): \$1000
 - First Serve: \$1000
 - Family Promise: \$1000
 - Akron-Canton Food Bank: \$1000
- At Janet Daniel's suggestion, the vestry voted to invite parishioners to contribute the money they would have given for Easter flowers to a fund that will be given to Open M, which has seen a surge in need for food and requests for meals in the current economic situation.
- Kathy Garber reported on our new online giving portal, which will allow people to give online with a credit card or electronic check. The portal is at the far right on the tool bar on the Christ Church website (www.christchurchhudson.org).
- The building committee has decided to have Level Heads and Krill
 proceed with the architectural drawings, since money is available. A
 determination to proceed with the building phase will be made at a later
 date. The "shelter in place" directive may impact construction work.
- Charlotte reported on the activities of the staff during this time when
 the building is closed. The building staff have been sent home, with
 pay, until April 15. The rest of the staff is working from home. Susie
 Vanaman is coming in once a week to pay bills. Kathy Garber is coming
 in two or three times a week to check the mail, deposit checks and
 check the building. All other work is happening from home and requiring about the same amount of time as under normal circumstances.
- Holy Week and Easter: Plans are underway for all services to be held via Zoom and Facebook Live. Because the COVID-19 situation is still rapidly changing, announcements about exactly how the services will happen will come out closer to the dates.

The next vestry meeting is Tuesday April 28 at 6pm one way or another!
