2021 Annual Stewardship

Our stewardship campaign will look a little different this year but we have a history of successful stewardship campaigns at Christ Church so we will rise to the current challenge.

Here's what you can expect this fall:

- A packet will go out in mid-September with a letter from the stewardship co-chairs, George Murray and Jim Lang, and the Rector. The packet will include a brochure with photos of some of our 2020 ministries and activities along with whatever construction photos we might have by press time, as well as a pledge card and return envelope.
- Because we cannot have a breakfast or other in-person event this year in which we can ask questions, a team of 14-15 people will call every household in late September to check in and answer any questions you might have.
- Pledges are due back to the church in early October. We know that the economic effects of the pandemic are felt unevenly across our congregation so we are asking that people who are able to raise their pledge do so knowing that others may need to reduce their financial support to Christ Church in 2021.
- Follow up calls will be made to folks we have not heard from by mid-October. Work will begin on the 2021 budget in November.

Rector's Reflections



Dear Friends,

I am excited! I am excited that we will soon begin construction on our building project which will make Christ Church a more accessible, more adaptable place for both our own groups and ministries as well as for our community groups. In the midst of the current challenges, we are creating a beautiful space that will move us into a future where we will make more use of technology to reach people, have space that is easier to keep clean, and that will allow us to be together and keep better physical distance as needed.

I am also excited as we move to more in-person worship and can resume the distribution of Holy Communion. There is information about our Sunday worship schedule elsewhere in this Communicant.

Lastly, I am excited about the new ways we have found to be the church online and in the community over the last 6 months. From meetings, to Sunday worship, to special worship services, to mid-week gatherings, we have adapted to new ways of doing things. We are adding in-person worship back to all that we offer online, not replacing our online experiences. We will be "physically distant but socially and spiritually connected" for a good while yet and we will likely never go back to in-person only worship.

As with all new things, there will be bumps in the road and inconveniences. As we proceed with construction, the staff will likely work from home quite a bit due to the noise and dust of construction and the lack of a restroom in Beebe House. The 9am Sunday service may be disrupted if there is an increase in Covid-19 cases in our county or community. But if we've learned anything these last 6 months, we have learned patience and flexibility! The next few months will be exciting, challenging, interesting, and, at times, frustrating. But they will certainly not be boring! We will move through the next few months the way we have moved through the last 6 months-together!

construction, our last service in the Memorial Garden will be Sunday, September 6.

Frequently Asked Questions about resuming in-person worship with Holy Eucharist

- ◆ Why 9am? 9am is a compromise between 8am and 10:30. Mario, Robin, and Charlotte will have about 20 minutes to take down the 9 o'clock service and set up for Zoom and Facebook Live before streaming begins.
- Will we need to sign up? Absolutely! Sign-ups are required. There will be a sign-up genius online or you can call the church office.
- Why the 30 person limit? We want to make sure we can assure a 6 foot physical distance between each household. Depending on who signs up, we may be able to add a few more slots. But we are going to start small, then we can grow as/if appropriate.
- Are masks required? Yes. There is a supply at each entrance in case you forget yours.
- What about hand sanitizer? We have touchless hand sanitizer dispensers at each entrance and ask you to please use the hand sanitizer as you come in.
- Will we have bulletins? Yes, they will be on the usher table for you to pick up as you come in.
- ◆ What about Passing the Peace? Yes and no. Yes, we will exchange the peace, but verbally only and from 6 feet away.
- What about passing the offering place? No. There will be an offering plate at each entrance for your offering.
- Any chance of singing? Unfortunately, no. We will have music, just no singing.
- How will we receive communion?

Come forward at the direction of the usher, maintaining 6 feet between each household. Receive the bread in the palm of your hand. Distribution of the wine is not allowed. Return to your seat where you can briefly remove your mask and prayerfully consume the wafer.

- What happens if Covid-19 numbers go up? The Rector and Wardens will carefully monitor the situation in Summit County and the actions of Hudson City Schools and will make decisions accordingly. The 10:30 Zoom/Facebook Live service will be our constant worship experience. The vestry is aware that we may start in-person worship with Holy Eucharist and then have to suspend that service for a while if numbers go up.
- ♦ How long will the 9am in-person and the 10:30 livestreams be our Sunday Schedule? The plan is to keep this schedule through the end of the year, subject to change with changing circumstances. The goal is to have the technology to livesteam in-person services and that will come as part of the building project, hopefully by the end of the year. If that is the case, then we'll have a new plan for January. Flexibility is the name of the game here.



August Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry meeting began with a Bible study about endurance, and prayer.
- The financials were reviewed through the end of July. Pledge income is down about \$9000 from this time last year.
- There was lengthy discussion about resuming in-person worship inside as well as the distribution of communion. The decision was made to begin a 9am service on September 20 with communion and continue the 10:30 service online. (More on that on page 3).
- Peter Eells joined the vestry meeting at 6:45 to talk about the
 possibility of a project to use solar panels to create some of our
 electricity. He is working with the City of Hudson to figure out
 what we might be allowed to do since Christ Church is in the
 Historic District. The vestry is waiting for more information on
 hat process as well as the cost.
- Tina Monreal is working with Key Bank on a Line of Credit to fund the building project while the remaining pledges come in over the next 2-3 years. We are waiting to hear the terms of the loan before moving ahead. The loan will require the permission of the Standing Committee of the Diocese.
- Construction is set to begin right after Labor Day.
- The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, September 22 at 6pm on Zoom.
