Rector's Reflections



Dear Friends,

The early Christians put down everything they were doing to journey together through the days of Holy Week from Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, to his last supper with the disciples and the giving of the command or mandate "to do this in remembrance of me," to the cross and the tomb, and finally to the empty tomb on Easter morning. Together the faithful journeyed through the wild joy of Palm Sunday to the intimacy of Maundy Thursday, to the despair of Good Friday, in order to arrive at Easter fully aware of the cost of God's love.

While most of us are not able to put everything down for a week to undertake such a journey, what the early Christians knew and passed on to us is the fact that we are not meant to journey through Holy Week alone. However, because of the pandemic, that is exactly what we have had to do for the past two years. We have engaged the Holy Week journey on Zoom and Facebook, struggling to connect with the story and each other. What we have learned is both that the mysteries of Holy Week and Easter are greater than any pandemic AND how easy it is to turn away from the story when left to our own devices.

This year, we plan to gather in-person for all of our Holy Week and Easter services. Information on each of the services can be found on the cover of this Communicant and will be in the announcements and eNews. My prayer is that Holy Week 2022 will offer us once again the joy and wonder of journeying together.

The Election of a New Bishop

Last September, Bishop Hollingsworth called for the election of a Bishop Co-Adjutor who will become the Diocesan Bishop upon Bishop Hollingsworth's retirement. Such a transition involves the work of many people including several people at Christ Church. Greg Daniels serves on the Search Committee which will identify 3-5 nominees by mid-August. Tina Monreal has been appointed to the Transition Committee which will coordinate the walk-about to introduce the nominees to the Diocese, plan the election and consecration, and assist the bishop-elect in a variety of ways. Dave McCallops and the Rev. Charlotte Reed serve on the Standing Committee, which oversees the entire process. 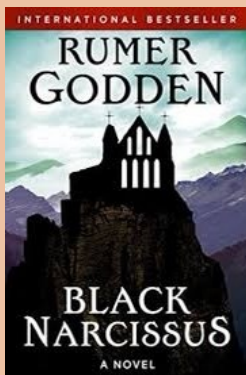

The nursery is located in the undercroft for children 3 and under from 10:00 a.m. to noon each Sunday.

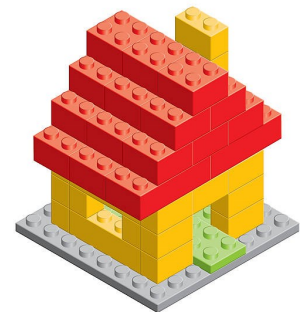


CHILDREN'S CHAPEL

CHRISTIAN UNITY PRAYER SERVICE AND LUNCHEON - APRIL 28



The annual Christian Unity Prayer Service and Luncheon that was scheduled for January 20 will now be held on April 28 at St. Mary Catholic Church in Hudson. The ecumenical service, led by local clergy, begins at 10:00 AM. It is followed by a luncheon and guest speaker. The service, traditionally held during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, has the theme, "We saw his star in the East, and we came to worship him" (Matthew 2:2). Rev. Lawrence Jurcak if St. Mary's Parish will give the sermon.

After the service, a box lunch will be served for ticket holders. The box lunches are catered by Nosh's of Hudson. Ticket price is \$15.00 per person and may be obtained from Gretchen Green. **The reservation deadline is April 8.** The prayer service is free and open to all; it does not require a ticket to attend.

The featured speaker after the luncheon is Rev. Nayiri Karjian, from Living Water Association. An Armenian Christian born and raised in Aleppo, Syria, she was educated in Beirut, Lebanon and received her Master of Divinity degree from Lancaster Theological Seminary in Pennsylvania. Since her ordination in 1985 she has served UCC congregations in several cities throughout the United States.



Security Awareness Training

Wednesday, May 11

6:00 p.m. in the Parish Hall

Presented by James Boazzo

If you were unable to attend our first Security Awareness Training in February, we will be holding another session in May. The purpose of the training is to educate our members in the event any of us ever find ourselves in an active shooter situation. Throughout my over 13 years as an FBI Agent, I have responded to mass shooting events such as the 2015 Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Charleston, SC, the 2016 Pulse Night Club Shooting in Orlando, Florida, and the 2016 police shootings in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. I will draw on my experiences from these events to stress the importance of the mindset needed during an active shooter situation. Above all, adequate preparation and training is imperative. Our training will consist of a presentation by me in the Parish Hall in which I will present background/statistics regarding active shooter events and I will provide you a few security consider points for our church. Also, we will watch a short video that is intended to change your mind set in the event you are confronted with an active shooter situation. Neither the training itself nor the video should cause you apprehension. I would consider the rating of this training to be PG-13. Therefore, I hope you will all join me in the Parish Hall on May 11 from 6pm to 7pm. New Christ Church Firearms Policy

While we have signs up prohibiting firearms in the church, there is no current firearms policy on record. The Vestry voted to approve the following policy as part of our increasing awareness of security at Christ Church.

In accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 2923.12, 2923.121, 2923.122, 2923.126 no one may carry a handgun into places of worship, unless the place of worship permits otherwise. The firearms policy of Christ Church is as follows:

No firearms, or any other dangerous weapons, shall be permitted on the premises of Christ Church with the exception of those carried by trained law enforcement officers. Law enforcement officers are trained in such areas as crisis intervention, active shooter response, de-escalation, and proper non-lethal tactics. Most parishioners, even those with a concealed carry permit, do not have this level of training. In addition, firearms bring an enormous liability to the church. The potential for accidents, unintentional injury to innocent bystanders, excessive use of force, and confusion when police arrive over who is a threat, are all downsides that can offset any benefits of additional security. Accordingly, a license to carry a weapon does not supersede this policy.

Greetings!

I am so incredibly proud of the Young Choristers! They sang a wonderful Evensong on March 20th, which for many of them was their first time. Evensong is not an easy service to sing, with multiple pieces of music, different moving parts, and new prayers to learn. However, I am so proud of the Young Choristers continued dedication, hard work, and musical growth. Learning those notes takes a lot of practice and focus. Many thanks to Charlotte Beers Plank for playing the organ and Rowan and Kaitlyn for being there to help in the singing of the anthems. Another highlight, for me, was my dear friend and mentor, Bob Quade, was in attendance. Bob has conducted over 100 Evensongs and had many trips to England with choirs throughout his life, with choirs singing daily Evensong. Our Chorister program is based on the Royal School of Church Musicians (RSCM) model and Bob is the President Emeritus of the RSCM. The Choristers were quite excited about having him there!

Many of you have come up to me congratulating me on “my choir”. This is so far from the truth! This is not my choir, **this is YOUR choir!** Your donations and pledges help support the ministry of the Young Choristers at Christ Church. This program is free to all choristers, with the Christ Church music budget supplying the necessary workbooks and music. If you feel so moved, we welcome gifts to the Young Choristers program to help monetarily support their ministry. All this being said, it is your job as the congregation to support the choristers in their ministry. As I told them before we ended rehearsal, they are never here to perform. We sing for two purposes: 1. for the Glory of God, and 2. to lead the congregation in a more profound worship. With that being said, a supportive congregation is what makes a chorister program thrive. That means supporting them in your attendance, being there for their achievements, congratulating them, and singing along side them in the congregation. Choristers measure support by seeing a full congregation. We had a great congregation at Evensong, singing away, but remember that your attendance (including Sunday mornings!) allows for a more profound worship. This is your choir, support them in their ministry.

Hudson Food Pantry-Laundry Detergent Collection

The Christ Church monthly offering to the Hudson Food Pantry is liquid or pod laundry detergent, which cannot be purchased with government Assistance (SNAP). For April, the Hudson Food Pantry has requested **35 jugs or packs of pod detergent** by April 21 for this month's distribution. Updates on 2022 Christ Church Goals

Goal: Continue to develop our middle school youth formation program.

The Middle School Youth Formation Committee met on March 17. The main focus for March was participation in and support for the Young Choristers during Evensong as chorister or reader.

There are two main events on the calendar for April:

- A Middle School Easter event on April 15 which will include baking traditional Easter bread and filling / hiding Easter eggs before service for the Easter egg hunt on Easter morning.
- A Diocesan Middle School Retreat at Christ Church on April 23-24 for CCEH members, as well as friends, and members of other churches in the Diocese.

Planning for the summer includes an end of school year potluck and Middle School Youth participation as helpers at VBS.

Goal: Developing our outreach in conjunction with the desire for more fellowship.

The Outreach Committee Ministry met on March 6 and agreed on final recommendations for out-reach vestry budget allocations. Additional focus is on two fund raising events (one in late spring, one in the fall) to fund Habitat for humanity and to help with the significant Refugee problems (we started with a focus on Afghan refugees but expanded to include the expected Ukrainian war refugees who are flooding out of the Ukraine currently).

Goal: Further develop ways of communicating with the congregation and the community.

The Communications Subcommittee met on Tuesday, March 15. While we build up the committee and work on new ideas, we decided to focus on enhancing our current communications. Tom Dukes will interview one person/family for each Communicant and write a short vignette. We would also like to have photos of all parish events for use in the Communicant, eNews, and on the Facebook page as people tend to connect with photos. Since there are almost always vestry members at any parish event, we'd like for the vestry to be intentional about taking cell phone photos whenever they are at a church function.

March Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry met on Zoom on March 22 at 6pm.
- Ministry reports for Outreach, Communication, & Middle School Youth Group were discussed (read more on page 10).
- Tina Monreal discussed the development of a legacy society at Christ Church to encourage parishioners to consider Christ Church in their estate planning.
- The financials were presented and pledges are coming in nicely.
- Ann Kirk was appointed temporary acting treasurer.
- Kathy Garber and Tina Monreal presented the next items in line on the “must do” list. Those items include the gutters on the church, the window sashes in the church, & the Beebe House stair railings.
- James Boazzo presented a firearms policy for Christ Church. While we have signs up prohibiting firearms in the church, we do not have a policy on record. The new policy is part of our increasing awareness of security at Christ Church. (The policy adopted by the vestry is on page 7 of this Communicant.)
- The Diocese has offered up to \$150 to each congregation for a Jubilee celebration. The decision was made to have a picnic at Christ Church after the 10:30 service on May 15. The funds will be used to purchase “Mr. Chicken” and the vestry will provide sides and desserts.
- The Outreach budget was approved as follows:
 - Open M: \$1000; Bexley-Seabury: \$1000; First Serve: \$1000
 - Hope and Healing: \$750; Community Resource Coordinator: \$1000 (plus \$1500 from Rector’s Discretionary Fund)
 - Bail Project Cleveland: \$1000; Family Promise: \$500
 - Akron/Canton Food Bank: \$1000; Scripture Union: \$500
 - Rift Valley Children’s Center (Tanzania): \$1000
 - African Educational Partnership (Nigeria): \$1000
 - Total: \$9750 out of \$11,000 budget
 There will be fundraisers for Habitat for Humanity and a project to assist refugees in this area.

The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, April 26 at 6pm. Location TBD.
