

THE RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS



Dear Friends,

The fall has been glorious at Christ Church with renewed energy in worship, the return of Potluck Theology and Lego Church, a fabulous "Better Together" party, and many opportunities to help those in need. Now, all of a sudden, our attention is turning to Advent and our anticipation of the Christ Child in our midst. One of the highlights of Christmas at Christ Church is the Children's Christmas pageant, an event that makes an impact on me each and every year. Yes, the Christmas pageant makes the story of Jesus' birth come alive through the voices of our children. But even more than that, I think the production of the Christmas pageant tells us something about how we are called to follow Jesus.

First, there is a role for every child, regardless of age or ability (including the ability to follow directions). Every child is welcome and included and is a vital part of the story. How do we welcome and include every child of God in the Body of Christ in this church?

Secondly, no matter how well prepared the children are, there is always an element of chaos. Little sheep run through the church or climb around the steps, sometimes chased down by older siblings. The baby Jesus simply does not want to follow the "no crying he makes" directive. The mics take on a life of their own. The unexpected becomes expected. No matter how much we prepare, the life of following Jesus is not always (or maybe ever?) in our control and we can expect the unexpected. Where are we surprised by the unexpected as followers of Jesus?

Lastly, the story of Jesus' birth brings us great joy. I wonder if perhaps we open ourselves to be moved by the story more when told by our children than when we simply hear the story read or read it ourselves. The children delight in becoming shepherds, or sheep, or Magi, or even a camel. Their delight is contagious. Who are we in the Christmas story and which part of the story brings us delight?

As we move through Advent, I invite us to prepare for the arrival of the Christ child by watching for the unexpected as we seek to follow Jesus, by welcoming and including all of God's children in all aspects of our life together and in the wider community, and by opening ourselves to childlike delight in the arrival of Jesus in our midst. Our children have much to teach us!





I so look forward to Advent every year. What about Advent, you ask? Technically there are only twelve days of Christmas, and as you might have guessed, none of them are in November. In our church calendar, we have four Sundays of Advent (In Roman times, there were six weeks of Advent) and only a couple Sundays of Christmas. You may think, "That's it?" but yes that IS it.

History lesson: The word "advent" comes from the Latin *adventus* meaning "coming". It symbolizes the Second Coming of Christ. For a thousand years, Christians have spoken of three comings of Christ: at Bethlehem, in our hearts and minds, and in the glory of the end times. Advent is a time of anticipation and waiting for the coming of Christ.

This is why I am so excited about our Advent Lessons and Carols Service on December 11th, 5pm. It is a festive service: great choral music sung by our Adult Choir, big hymns, descants, etc. However, it is also a time for us to sit and reflect on the beauty of the scripture readings in Advent. This is a service I hope we continue to offer every year and I hope you come attend.

So I ask: what does Advent mean for you? Maybe, like Lent, we examine our own lives and see what we can do to be better followers of Christ. I ask myself each year: do I really need that new [insert electronic device here]? Is Christmas really about giving expensive presents to my friends who are already financially stable? What if I gave that money to someone less fortunate that me or is there a local soup kitchen that needs volunteers?

When I go to the store and see that 1,000th reindeer on the shelf and that blow-up elf for my front lawn, I am reminded that Jesus had none of these. Jesus didn't have a comfy bed, an electric space heater, or a cashmere coat. Instead, he had the love of others to welcome him into this world. May you all have a blessed Advent season. I so look forward to seeing you at Advent Lessons and Carols on December 11th at 5pm.

Get to Know The Le/Walvoord Family

In 2019, Drew Le (pronounced Lee) came to Kent State University as associate professor of piano. That move resulted in Christ Church's gain of an entire musical family! You have seen and heard Drew's fabulous performances on piano, both our small grand and the large one brought in for a Music of the Western Reserve concert. You have heard lovely duets with his wife Jenny Walvoord playing the violin. And you've seen and heard their children Matthew (11) and Kate (9) singing with the Young Choristers. What a musical gift to our parish!

Drew and Jenny grew up in Michigan - Drew in Kentwood (near Grand Rapids) and Jenny in Holland. She was active in the 3rd Reformed Church of America. They met, and later married, as faculty at Hope College, in Holland. Drew was then baptized in the Reformed Church. He be came a deacon in the church.



After teaching at Hope College for fourteen years, Drew was recruited by Kent State. They moved on August 3, 2019, a date that Matthew remembers because it was a major change in their lives. They visited several churches but, upon arriving at Christ Church, they immediately felt at home. Drew and Jenny appreciated the music program, especially the children's choir. Matthew said he had a strong sense of belonging. They had all been baptized in the Reformed Church, but quickly adjusted to the liturgy and traditions of the Episcopal Church.

Jenny, who had been a violinist with the Grand Rapids Symphony, has found a home with the Cleveland Pops Orchestra. She also gives private violin lessons. She is exploring an additional career as a UX (User Experience) designer. She will assist clients with website, app, and graphic design.

Matthew is in 6th grade at Hudson Middle School. Kate is in 4th grade at Eastwood Elementary. They like to read and play outside with their dogs Cookie and Coda.

You may have seen Drew with a very important-looking camera, snapping photos at church functions. He is a talented and dedicated amateur photographer, who has committed to a "365 Project," in which he takes a photo EVERY DAY, representing something memorable about that day. These are printed and collected in family albums.

What would this musical family like to see in the future for Christ Church? Continue to expand the Young Choristers. Drew would like a nine-foot Steinway! And Matthew says "continue to have amazing people who are friendly and welcoming."
