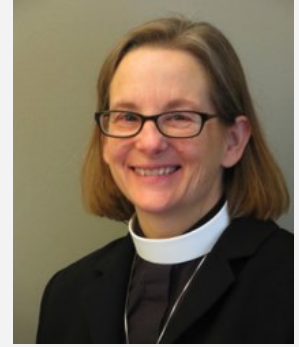

## THE RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS



Dear Friends,

If there has been an unintended theme to our Lenten journey this year, that theme has been “joy in the wilderness.” While we have kept a faithful and perhaps solemn Lenten journey in liturgy, prayer, study, and our own devotions and disciplines, our time in the wilderness has also been filled with joy. We have welcomed four baby boys this Lent and had a rose on the altar during this flower-less season three Sundays in a row. Between thirty and forty people from Christ Church and First Presbyterian have gathered in the Parish Hall on Wednesday evenings to enjoy a meal together, get to know one another better, and talk about the witnesses at the cross on the day of Jesus’ crucifixion. The Adult Forum on Sunday mornings has been filled with open, honest, and energetic conversation as we have worked through the book “Holy Envy” by Barbara Brown Taylor. The Outreach Ministry Team had a joy-filled “Peanut Butter and Jelly Brigade” as they made 300 PB&J’s for those in need in Akron.

While “joy” may not be the first word that comes to mind when we think of Lent, I believe that being able to find joy in the wilderness of Lent helps us in two ways. First, if we can find joy in the wilderness of Lent, we may be better able to find joy in the wilderness of our own lives. Secondly, if we can find joy in the wilderness of Lent, the joy we find in the resurrected Christ on Easter will be all the deeper and more glorious.

May the quiet wilderness joy of this Lent lead us all into the great resurrection joy of Easter.

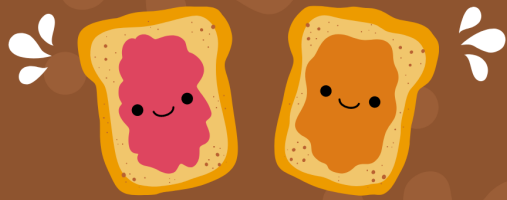
## Kirsten Homdrom, pianist, in Concert at Christ Church May 12<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm

Kirsten Homdrom will be returning to Christ Church to give a piano recital on Friday, May 12 at 6:00. Kirsten was a Trinity Scholar at Christ Church from 2007-2009. Kirsten joined the White Memorial staff in May 2015. As Associate Director of Music, Kirsten shares responsibility for the music ministry along with the Director of Music. In addition to playing both the piano and organ during worship, Kirsten directs choral and instrumental ensembles, and accompanies a variety of soloists and groups.

Previously, Kirsten served churches in Indiana and Ohio in both organist and director of music roles. Kirsten has also taught piano and organ to students of all ages, and has performed both in the United States and abroad. She has a passion for ministering to people by sharing God's gift of music in fellowship and faith. Kirsten holds a B.M. in piano performance from Baldwin-Wallace University Conservatory of Music, and a M.M. and D.M.A. in piano performance from the University of Cincinnati College, Conservatory of Music.

### Get to Know The Barnhardts

This has been the month for baby boys joining our Christ Church family. Schaeffer (Schay) Barnhardt and her husband Hunter Barnhardt welcomed twin sons Milton Colvin (Colvin) and Richard Flintom (Flint) on March 8. They joined five year-old sister Joan Walden. Here is the Barnhardts’ story.

Chatham Hall is the center of Schaeffer and Hunter’s relationship. It is an Episcopal boarding school in Virginia. Schaeffer grew up in Memphis, TN and Greenwich, CT but Chatham Hall was her (boarding) high school; Hunter’s home towns were Charlotte, NC and Roanoke, VA. ## **Hudson Food Pantry Laundry Detergent Collection**

## **Christ Church Firearms Policy**

The Vestry voted last year to approve the following policy as part of our increasing awareness of security at Christ Church.

In accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 2923.12, 2923.121, 2923.122, 2923.126 no one may carry a handgun into places of worship, unless the place of worship permits otherwise. The firearms policy of Christ Church is as follows:

*No firearms, or any other dangerous weapons, shall be permitted on the premises of Christ Church with the exception of those carried by trained law enforcement officers. Law enforcement officers are trained in such areas as crisis intervention, active shooter response, de-escalation, and proper non-lethal tactics. Most parishioners, even those with a concealed carry permit, do not have this level of training. In addition, firearms bring an enormous liability to the church. The potential for accidents, unintentional injury to innocent bystanders, excessive use of force, and confusion when police arrive over who is a threat, are all downsides that can offset any benefits of additional security. Accordingly, a license to carry a weapon does not supersede this policy.*

## February Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry met on Tuesday, February 28. The meeting opened with Bible study and prayer.
  - Ann Kirk reported that the Diocese has changed the requirements for the annual audit, thanks in part to the question raised by our own George Murray at our budget meeting. Rather than a full audit, Christ Church can have an Agreed Upon Procedures audit which will save \$3500-\$4000 on the cost.
  - Vestry officers were elected: James Boazzo, Sr. Warden; Judy Brookhart, Jr. Warden; Linda Irving, clerk; Ann Kirk, treasurer.
  - James Boazzo, Judy Brookhart, Ann Kirk, Jim Bear and Kathy Garber were authorized to sign checks for the church.
  - Jim Bear – Chair, Tom Green, Tina Monreal, Peter Eels, Ted Mailey and Ann Kirk were appointed to the Finance Committee.
  - Charlotte Reed and Tina Monreal reviewed the 2022 Parochial Report which was approved by the vestry.
  - The following liaisons to the vestry goals were appointed:
    - ◇ Judy Brookhart: Outreach
    - ◇ Families: Mark Metoki and Drew Le
    - ◇ Hospitality: Kathie Balcerzak and Greg Daniels
    - ◇ Christian Formation: Courtney Bixby and Jacob Phillips
  - Judy Brookhart reported on the Outreach Team meeting where the following recommendations were made for outreach financial contributions in 2023:
    - ◇ Bexley-Seabury Seminary: \$1000
    - ◇ Hudson Community Resource Coordinator: \$1000  
(an additional \$1500 will come from the Rector's discretionary fund)
    - ◇ Rift Valley Children's Village, Tanzania: \$1000
    - ◇ First Serve: \$1000
    - ◇ Akron/Canton Food Bank: \$1000
    - ◇ Family Promise: \$500
    - ◇ Habitat for Humanity: \$200 (with an additional \$800 from the pancake supper)
- The vestry approved these contributions.
- The vestry began planning an all parish event for May 21 similar to last year's Jubilee Sunday.
  - The meeting adjourned at 8:05.

## March Vestry Meeting Highlights

- The vestry met on Tuesday, March 28 at 6pm in the Parish Hall.
- The meeting opened with prayer and a Bible study on faithfulness.
- The treasurer reported nothing unusual in February. Pledges were tracking well through the end of February.
