### THE RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS



Dear Friends,

You are amazing! Our final stewardship numbers for 2024 include 18 new pledges, which I have never seen before, and 62 increased pledges for a total of 122 pledges and over \$512,000 pledged. There are so many people to thank for such great success. Jim Lang and George Murray laid the foundation for this pledge campaign over their years of heading up stewardship. They also head up the Fellowship Committee that put on the pancake breakfast, giving the vestry the opportunity to come to the parish with the financial situation of Christ Church. The vestry, led by James Boazzo and Judy Brookhart, took on the task of creating the program and making follow-up phone calls. Kathy Garber made pledge cards and produced the packets. But the bulk of the credit goes to each and every one of you who made a pledge to support the mission and ministry of Christ Church in 2024. Together we can do amazing things!

Now we move into Advent, that beautiful, quiet season of anticipation. If you are new to the Episcopal Church, you may wonder why we do not sing Christmas hymns in December when the rest of the world seems to have been doing Christmas since Halloween. Advent is a time to prepare for the birth of the Christ Child and to savor that preparation so that we are ready to welcome him when he bursts into our lives on Christmas Eve. We hear the stories from scripture that lead up to Jesus' birth, light candles that mark the weeks until Christmas, and sing hymns that remind us that Jesus' birth is not here yet. We are reminded that what we are now is not all that we ever will be as Jesus comes into our hearts over and over again to transform our lives.

These weeks of Advent are precious as we wait, prepare, and anticipate together. Then on Christmas Eve, we will greet the Christ Child the way we do everything else. Together.

I so look forward to Advent every year. What about Advent, you ask? Technically there are only twelve days of Christmas, and as you might have guessed, none of them are in November. In our church calendar, we have four Sundays of Advent (In Roman times, there were six weeks of Advent) and only a couple Sundays of Christmas. You may think, "That's it?" but yes that IS it.

History lesson: The word "advent" comes from the Latin adventus meaning "coming". It symbolizes the Second Coming of Christ. For a thousand years, Christians have spoken of three comings of Christ: at Bethlehem, in our hearts and minds, and in the glory of the end times. Advent is a time of anticipation and waiting for the coming of Christ.

This is why I am so excited about our **Advent Lessons and Carols** Service on December 10 at 5 pm. It is a festive service: great choral music sung by our Adult Choir, big hymns, descants, etc. However, it is also a time for us to sit and reflect on the beauty of the scripture readings in Advent. Our service last year was so well received, I am glad we are doing it again this year.

So I ask: what does Advent mean for you? Maybe, like Lent, we examine our own lives and see what we can do to be better followers of Christ. I ask myself each year: do I really need that new [insert electronic device here]? Is Christmas really about giving expensive presents to my friends who are already financially stable? What if I gave that money to someone less fortunate that me or is there a local soup kitchen that needs volunteers?

When I go to the store and see that 1,000th reindeer on the shelf and that blow-up elf for my front lawn, I am reminded that Jesus had none of these. Jesus didn't have a comfy bed, an electric space heater, or a cashmere coat. Instead, he had the love of others to welcome him into this world. May you all have a blessed Advent season. I so look forward to seeing you at Advent Lessons and Carols on December 10th.




## The Frosty 5 and Mistletoe Mile Restrooms for Runners!



### Get to Know Ellen Turner

Are you looking for a way to serve your neighbors, in the parish or for outreach? Coffee hour host? Flower delivery (to folks who can't make it to church)? Dinner prep for youth group? Peanut butter & jelly brigade? Representative to the Diocesan Convention? Habitat for Humanity? Co-chair of the committee for funeral receptions? Yes, ALL of these ministries are accomplished by Ellen Turner...and she's not even fully retired!

Ellen's dad would be proud of her, but not surprised. Her father was an Episcopal priest, who served as chaplain at Kansas State University and later at churches in the dioceses of Indiana, Maryland, Washington DC and Pennsylvania. Ellen was confirmed at the National Cathedral in Washington, DC. She also heard Bishop Tutu preach there and received Communion from his hands. Quite a memory!

She attended Kenyon College (an Episcopal College in Gambier, OH), earning a degree in sociology. After graduation, she worked in admissions for six years. She then attended Harvard, earning a Master's degree in Counseling. She remained in Massachusetts, working at Northfield-Mount Hermon School, in various capacities (counselor, academic dean, teacher, etc.) for twenty-five years. When she returned to Ohio, she chose to work for Kenyon again doing admissions work.



At Northfield-Mount Hermon, Ellen met Dick Peller, whose late wife had been one of Ellen's friends. Their children were teenagers when their mother died. After a few years, Ellen and Dick married, in 2000. Ellen is proud to be their second mom.

Their move to Hudson, in 2015, happened because Dick's daughter and their son- in-law were working at Western Reserve Academy. Dick and Ellen were happy grandparents for a year, until the young family moved...to Taiwan! By this time, Ellen and Dick had gotten quite fond of Hudson and the many opportunities here, such as hiking, the amazing library and museums. And so they stayed.

Christ Church was a natural fit for Ellen. She loves the clear windows and all of the light in the sanctuary and now in the Parish Hall. As so many others have said, she appreciates good sermons (by our several preachers), excellent music, and a warm community. Dick supports all her service (see above) and is a regular with Habitat for Humanity. He even helped weed the church gardens. He is partly retired, teaching mathematics at WRA.

Their children and grandchildren live in Brazil and in California, but Ellen and Dick now have roots in Hudson. We at Christ Church are very glad!





### Updates from the Annual Diocesan Convention held on November 11, 2023.

It was an honor and a privilege to represent Christ Church Hudson at the 207th Diocesan Convention in Wooster. OH on Friday, November 10th, and Saturday November 11th. The Convention Eucharist was held at First Presbyterian Church and was a glorious celebration of our liturgy. The service was followed by the Convention Banquet held at the Greystone Event Center. We were treated to a delightful meal and had time to connect with many old and new friends from around the diocese. The diocesan staff planned a game of trivia which was entertaining and enlightening. Saturday, November 11th the business of the 207th Diocesan Convention began at 9AM. It was probably the best diocesan convention that I have ever attended. Bishop Anne made the convention fun and kept us on track with the work we were there to do. The morning began with the election of many people to a variety of positions for example: Standing Committee, Diocesan Council, Diocesan Trustees, Episcopal Community Services (ECS) Development Council, just to name a few. There is a lot of hard work ahead, but with the leadership of Bishop Anne Jolly and the Diocesan Staff we are well prepared for the future. We spent time together at our table discussing the results of the listening sessions which Bishop Anne held this past spring and summer. Thank you for allowing me to be a delegate. As Bishop Anne said: "I love being your bishop" ... I would respond I love having Anne Jolly as my bishop.

The business meeting of this 2023 Diocesan Convention on Saturday, November 11, went as smoothly as could be. Best of all was the strong fellowship of our own team, eight of us, I believe. That we pretty much voted the same—at least I think we did—was less about conformity and more about shared wisdom.

So focused we were that the meeting ended an hour-and-a-half early! I am looking forward to being a garden-variety participant at Winter Convention where we will get a taste of the College of Congregational Development. Onward and upward, indeed!

#### **Diocesan Convention updates continued**

Put about 300 Episcopalians in a room; include a few bishops; add coffee, tea, and chocolate; give them a chance to ponder and discuss the future of the diocese; and you generate a huge amount of hope and energy. Our new Bishop Ann gave an Episcopal address that included table talks around the priorities that emerged from the 16 listening sessions that she held with clergy and lay members of the diocese last summer. Congregational development, connecting to all congregations, addressing systemic racism, innovation, ministering to young families, and administration (including finance and building management) will all be addressed and advanced by the Bishop, her staff, and the people of the diocese.

Our own Tina Monreal presented a very detailed and balanced diocesan budget which was unanimously accepted. Both she and Dave McCallops were wearing their well deserved Bishop's Medals. During a screening of Bellwether Farm's Summer Camp highlights, Will Bixby's smiling face appeared. He served as a camp counselor.

The bishop plans a 3-year rotation of Sunday visits to parishes, with members of her staff also stopping by from time to time. She looks forward to worshipping with us, but also wants to celebrate and have fun with us. She has instituted "Fun Days," when she or one of her staff will join a parish for fellowship, outreach, or a community activity.

We are a relatively small denomination these days, but we are mighty, with much to offer the world around us. Love, peace, prayer, acceptance, and, above all, hope, will advance the work and joy of God's Kingdom. We can do it!

### **November Vestry Meeting Highlights**



- The vestry meet on November 28 at 6:00 p.m. and began with conversation about where we have seen God in the past month and with prayer.
- Ann Kirk, the treasurer, reported that pledged giving is down this year. About \$60,000 is needed between now and the end of the year to complete 2023 pledges.
- The vestry reviewed the 2024 draft budget and will vote to adopt the budget at the December meeting.
- The vestry elected Pam Zuhl to fill out Judy Brookhart's unexpired vestry term.
- There was discussion about when to hold the 2024 Annual Meeting. The decision was made to try holding it after an abbreviated 10:30 service on Sunday, January 28 with an activity for children during the meeting. The goal is to be finished with the service and the Annual Meeting by 11:40 and then have coffee hour afterwards.
- The vestry received the final pledge report which includes 18 new pledges, 69 increased pledges, 122 pledging units, and \$512,985 pledged.
- The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, November 28 at 6pm in the Upper Room.
