In addition to playing both the piano and organ during worship, Kirsten directs choral and instrumental ensembles, and accompanies a variety of soloists and groups.

Previously, Kirsten served churches in Indiana and Ohio in both organist and director of music roles. Kirsten has also taught piano and organ to students of all ages, and has performed both in the United States and abroad. She has a passion for ministering to people by sharing God's gift of music in fellow ship and faith. Kirsten holds a B.M. in piano performance from Baldwin-Wallace University Conservatory of Music, and a M.M. and D.M.A. in piano performance from the University of Cincinnati College, Conservatory of Music.

Hudson Food Pantry-Laundry Detergent Collection



The Christ Church monthly offering to the Hudson Food Pantry is liquid or pod laundry detergent, which cannot be purchased with government assistance (SNAP). The Hudson Food Pantry has requested 35 jugs or packs of pod detergent by February 23 for the February distribution. Detergent can be left

Volunteers Wanted for Project Learn of Summit County

I teach English to immigrants for Project Learn of Summit County. Our organization relies on a lot of volunteer effort to support adult students learning English and adult students working toward their GEDs.

There are several students in my online English class who are interested in being matched with a volunteer for weekly English conversation practice. There are other volunteer needs as well, if you are interested in helping with something else. Some students would like in person meetings, for example, at Cuyahoga Falls library, and some would prefer meeting online (Zoom or Facetime, etc.).

I am aware there has been some interest in finding ways to form relationships with refugees or immigrants, and this would be very helpful if you have time and interest. I started out as an English conversation volunteer and really enjoyed it. I am now in my second year as an instructor. Most students are very eager to learn!

Volunteers can start any time, but January is a great time and we are looking for a number of new volunteers now. Melissa Paul is the volunteer coordinator. January Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry met on Tuesday, January 26 at 6:00 p.m. in the Upper Room.
- The vestry began with a pizza dinner to thank the outgoing vestry members and welcome the new members. The current vestry members were each invited to offer one piece of advice to the new members. New members were invited to ask one question of the current members.
- Vestry members were asked to choose a vestry goal to lead.
 Those assignments will be finalized at the vestry retreat. The
 vestry members assigned to each goal are asked to recruit other
 parishioners to form a team to move forward with the goal.
- The vestry reviewed the financials from the close of 2022.
 Amazingly we came within \$17,000 of making our 2022 pledge goal despite losing a number of people to death or a move during the year.
- James Boazzo reported on the work of the Security Committee, which includes working to make the undercroft safer for our children and installing a Ring doorbell on the back of the door so the staff can see who is entering the building. More work is yet to be done on providing security on Sunday morning as well as training for ushers and Sunday School teachers.
- Thank you notes were read from Daniel Grossoehme and Allan Belton for the Christmas gifts they received from the vestry and parish.
- The vestry retreat is Saturday, January 28. The next vestry meeting is Tuesday, February 28 at 6pm in the Upper Room.
