

BELLWETHER FARM MUSIC AND VISUAL CAMP

- -Registration/Check in (1-2 people): Make sure payment and registration info is in and correct.
- Pass out name tags. Greet parents and children daily
- -Check out (1): greet parents at the door at the end of each day and checking out their child(ren) with their teachers
- -Drama (2-3): perform little skits during opening and closing gatherings—can be teens
- -Service Learning (1): teach lessons and activities about the mission project for the week
- -Arts (1): lead easy arts and crafts that help to build connections with the day's theme
- -Science and Nature (1): lead easy science experiments and nature lessons
- -Shepherds (2 for each grade level 1st-6th Grade—12 total): lead group to each rotation station. Lead reflection time at the start of each day
- -PreK/K Leader (3-4): lead the PreK/K classes in all activities

Support roles:

- -Shopping: food for snacks, supplies for rotations, etc.
- -Administrative work: making copies, cutting out materials, prepping materials for rotations
- -Set up (3-4): Setting up chairs and rooms each morning (by 8:30)
- -Tear down (3-4): putting chairs and supplies away at the end of each day.
- -Prepping crafts: getting crafts supplies ready to go for each day





On May 14, we had a glorious youth-led service. Eleven children and youth were involved in leading worship through reading Scripture, prayers (which were written by the youth group), preaching, and music. We also featured two 4th grade ushers who did a fabulous job. We certainly are blessed by fantastic kids at Christ Church and it was wonderful to showcase their talents and faith.

Get to Know The Edwards Family

Akron Children's Hospital is the reason that the Edwards moved to Hudson. Gordon, having experience in healthcare management in several states, became CFO at the hospital. Theresa facilitated the move with a high school senior (Joelle, called Jo) and a fourth grader (Walter). Their oldest child is Maureen, called Mo, who is finishing her junior year at the University of Alabama.

Gordon and Theresa were both born in Seattle, WA. They met at the University of Washington in Seattle. After marriage in 1996, they moved several times when Gordon, a CPA, had opportunities in healthcare. Their moves include Seattle, Portland, OR, LaCrosse, WI, Vancouver, WA, and Marshfield, WI. Theresa worked in human resources and also as a stay-at-home mom, coordinating all those moves!

Their story of coming to the Episcopal Church will be a familiar one to many of us. She was Catholic and he was Methodist. After marriage and baptisms in the Catholic Church, they discovered Trinity Episcopal Cathedral in Portland, OR and "knew the Episcopal church was where we belonged."

Their location prior to Hudson was Marshfield, WI, which does not have an Episcopal church. They attended Lutheran and Presbyterian churches "but it just wasn't the same." Moving to Hudson, "we were so excited to worship at an Episcopal church again!" They appreciated the warm welcome, the music, and Sunday school for Walter.

Walter is a gamer, especially Smash Bros. and Minecraft. Jo, who likes reading and watching document taries, has chosen The Ohio State University for next fall. Mo plays the violin (ten years!) and likes singing, reading, and writing. She is majoring in Accounting (sounds familiar) with minors in Spanish and Creative Writing.

Theresa "believes for any church to be sustainable, there needs to be a focus on Christian education, including Sunday school and youth programming."

May Vestry Meeting Highlights



- The vestry met on Tuesday, May 23 at 6pm. The meeting began with prayers & bible study about community.
- Ann Kirk, our treasurer, reported that she has moved funds from a money market account to a 7 month CD with a 5% interest rate. She also noted the pledge income was down in April and Kathy Garber noted that it has also been down in May. Ann reported that the annual audit, which is an Agreed Upon Procedures audit this year, should be complete within the next 10 days.
- James Boazzo and Judy Brookhart, Sr. and Jr. Wardens, reported on a meeting they had with the wardens of surrounding Episcopal congregations to share what is working and what is challenging in each congregation and to build relationships. They will meet again in the fall.
- The vestry debriefed Celebration Sunday, which was a wonderful success. It was noted that we had very few families with young children and recognized that May is a very busy time for them. There was a stellar turn out from the youth group.
- The vestry began making plans for the fall stewardship program, recognizing the twin priorities of providing better information about the finances of the church as we did at the "Fill the Gap" meeting last November and remembering that at its heart, stewardship is a relational matter based on one's relationship with God and each other.
- The next meeting is Tuesday, July 11 at 6pm in the Parish Hall.
