

Dear Friends,

At the vestry retreat in late January, your vestry spent a good bit of time simply getting to know each other. We found connections between each other that we did not know about and heard stories that deepened our relationships. Bible studies helped us share stories and think deeply together about topics like gratitude and generosity. At Potluck Theology in February, we all brought favorite dishes from our childhood to share and told stories about those dishes and the people who inspired them. At the end of both the vestry retreat and Potluck Theology, we were amazing at all we had learned about each other. We worship together, enjoy coffee hour together, and work side by side in many ministries, and yet often we don't really know each other.

The vestry hopes to help us deepen our relationships with each other over the next year and there will be a variety of opportunities to do that. 


CCEH Ladies Night Out Tuesday, March 21st at 6:00 p.m.

March 21st at 8:00 p.m. on Zoom





Kirsten Homdrom, pianist, in Concert at Christ Church May 12th at 6:00 pm

Kirsten Homdrom will be returning to Christ Church to give a piano recital on Friday, May 12 at 6:00. Kirsten was a Trinity Scholar at Christ Church from 2007-2009. Kirsten joined the White Memorial staff in May 2015. As Associate Director of Music, Kirsten shares responsibility for the music ministry along with the Director of Music. In addition to playing both the piano and organ during worship, Kirsten directs choral and instrumental ensembles, and accompanies a variety of soloists and groups.

Previously, Kirsten served churches in Indiana and Ohio in both organist and director of music roles. Kirsten has also taught piano and organ to students of all ages, and has performed both in the United States and abroad. She has a passion for ministering to people by sharing God's gift of music in fellow ship and faith. Kirsten holds a B.M. in piano performance from Baldwin-Wallace University Conservatory of Music, and a M.M. and D.M.A. in piano performance from the University of Cincinnati College, Conservatory of Music.

Get to Know The Ryersons

The beautiful Good Shepherd stained glass window is the focal point in our new Parish Hall. But have you noticed the small gray plaque on the wall near it? The restoration of the window was a donation from Peter and Nan Ryerson, in memory of their son David. He was a student at the University of Toledo College of Medicine when he died in a plane crash in 1994. The Ryersons have funded a first-year scholarship to the medical school ever since, but they wanted a lasting memorial here at Christ Church. The window (1894) was in the basement, in disrepair. During the Capital Campaign, Guy Wylie asked if its restoration might be a suitable gift. They agreed, the window was shipped to Texas for repair, and the results are here for all to enjoy. Thank you, Ryersons!



Peter, a lifelong Episcopalian, grew up in a suburb of Philadelphia. Out of high school, he served with the U.S. Army in Korea for 14 months. Then he was stationed in Virginia, where he visited a distant relative for Christmas and met Nan, home from college. A mutual fondness for his VW bug and for ice-skating was the happy beginning.

Nan's childhood included four years in Egypt, when her father served in the OSS (now CIA). She has strong memories of that time, especially being taken to see a belly dancer as a birthday treat. Her parents were Unitarians, but she immediately felt at home in the Episcopal church after she began attending with Peter.

They were married on March 30, 1963 at the Episcopal church in Falls Church, VA, where George Washington worshipped. That's right - 1963 - they will celebrate their 60th anniversary this month!

Nan and Peter took turns working and going to college. In 1979, he was hired by Akron City Hospital in management systems. In 1989, they formed Ryerson Health Care Consulting, which provided management for emergency and operating rooms in hospitals in 49 states. They shared responsibilities for sales, personnel, oversight, reporting, etc. They retired in 2011.

In 2017, they were seeking a new church home. Nan's mother lived at Laurel Lake and the first church they visited was Christ Church. They immediately "felt a sense of family" and appreciated the "warm and welcoming atmosphere." They also liked Charlotte's caring leadership.

Peter and Nan have a son and family in Dublin, OH. Peter is very active in the VFW and also in SCORE, an organization of retired professionals who advise start-up companies. Nan assists the University of Akron Women's Committee with scholarship funding and other projects. She's also interested in historical preservation, antiques, and gardening.

They have two goals for Christ Church: to see the church full, especially with an outreach to veterans. They also encourage a stronger endowment fund, to provide long-term financial stability.

Thank you for the window, and for all else you do for the greater good.
